One Client's Story:

Police found Mr. D disoriented and wandering a store parking lot. He was immediately taken to the hospital where he was quickly diagnosed with Stage 4 lung cancer, brain swelling and other extreme medical issues. He lives with his elderly, frail, 91-year-old mother. He worked until this hospitalization. Mother's modest Social Security pays the rent, but his income covered the other living expenses of the household.

A granddaughter is trying to deal with all the complicated affairs of medical decisions, elder care for the Mother, and the shock of the unexpected situation. Like many families, there was no real plan to take care of this sort of catastrophe. The immediate need was for someone to pay the utility bills, for the household until arrangements and decisions were made. HSA was able to step in and immediately relieve this financial burden. This compassionate action gave peace of mind to the granddaughter as she continues to deal with difficult family issues.
